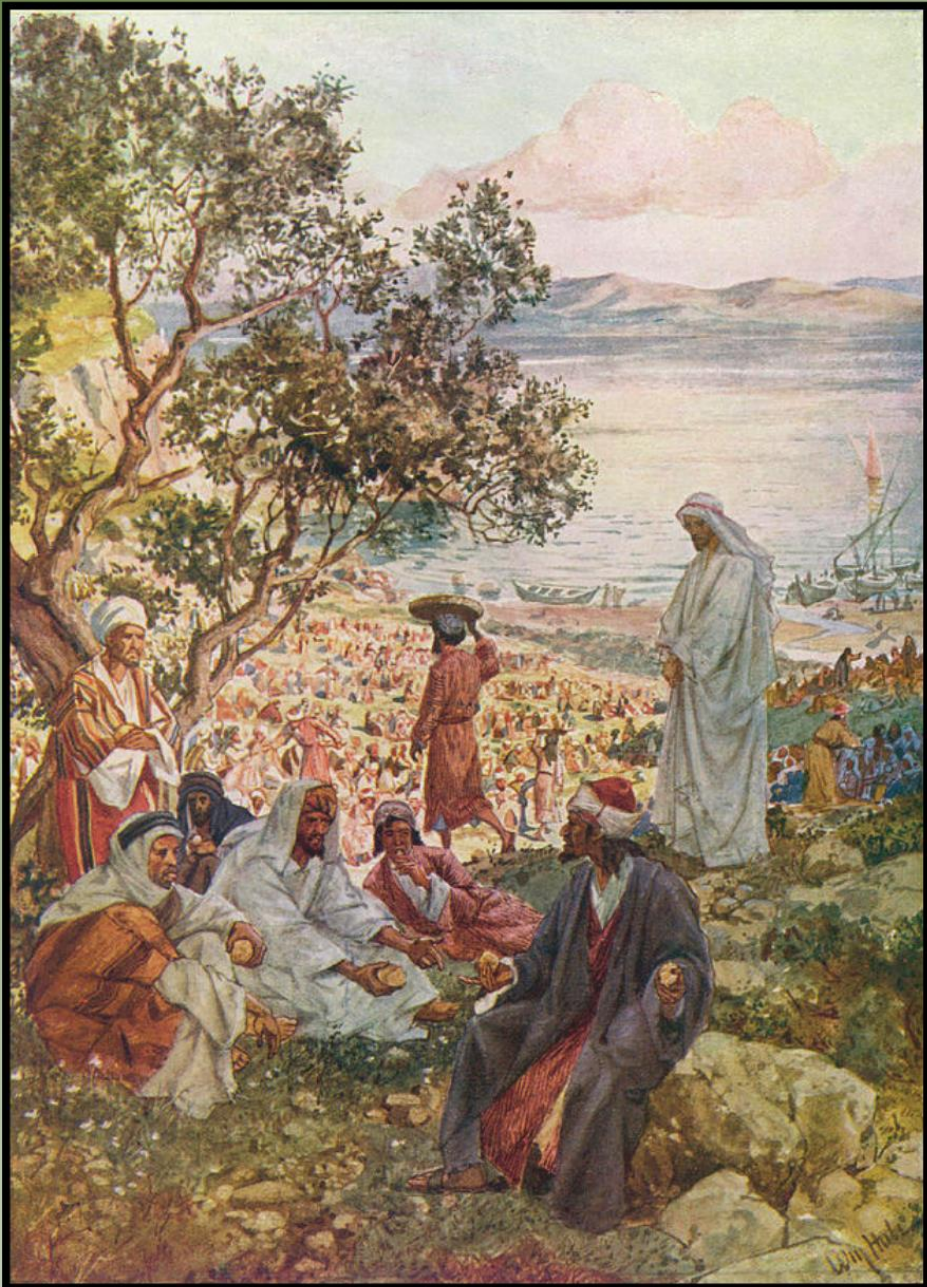

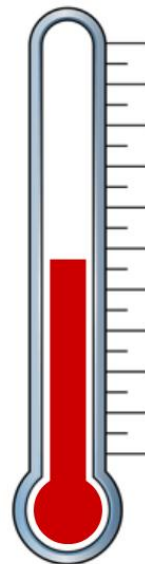

A Parish Group for Young Catholic Men



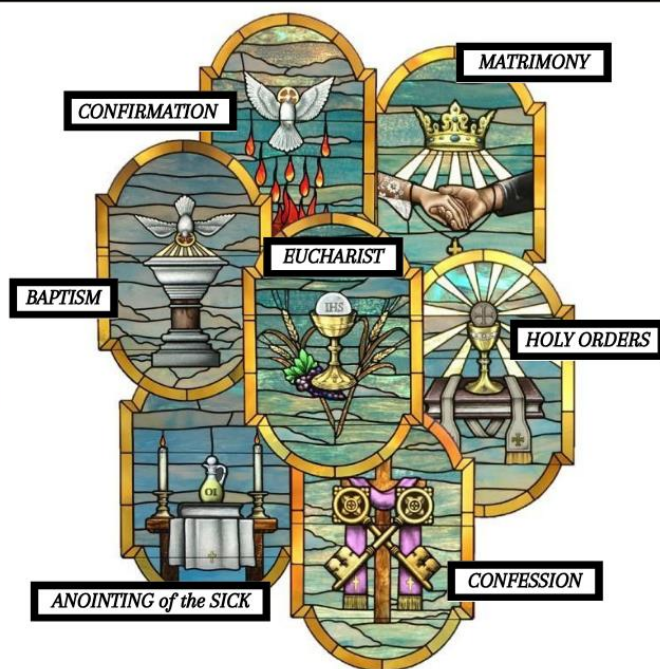
Are you a young Catholic man in your **20s or 30s** who desires to grow as a man of faith and virtue with like-minded men your age?

What we offer in faith, the Lord makes abundant!



Jesus said to His disciples, “Give them some food yourselves,” but they said to Him, “Five loaves and two fish are all we have here,” so Jesus replied, “Bring them here to Me.” (Matthew 14: 16-18)

When our resources seem insufficient to meet a particular need, it can become overwhelming, if not downright discouraging. I can remember some ‘lean’ times in life growing up when we had to make do with less, and looking back, it’s still hard to believe how we managed so much with so little. The fear of ‘not having enough’ can be a real barrier to our generosity, too, leading us to hesitate when we are asked to contribute our time, our labor, or our finances for needs in our community, and in our parish. I get it! After all, many of us have families to provide for, and some of us have even fallen on hard times financially or are experiencing a decline in health. It can leave us to wonder if our small contributions can make a difference, as the disciples were certainly wondering themselves in the face of thousands of hungry people gathered around Jesus.

Nevertheless, Jesus receives what little His disciples have left to offer: five loaves and two fish. It was hardly enough to feed a few people, let alone five thousand of them! Yet something miraculous happens: what they offered, Jesus multiplies to an overwhelming abundance! The crowds ate to their satisfaction, and twelve baskets were stuffed with what was left over. ***When we offer what we have to God, God multiplies it beyond measure to provide for His people.***

This is no less true for us today. When I look at everything that needs to be done to maintain our parish properties and buildings, and when I see how many people in Bellevue live in material and spiritual poverty, there are moments when I feel overwhelmed and, I’ll admit, pretty discouraged! Yet I’ve also seen how far the contributions of a few generous people can go when they allow God to receive and bless their work! God always provides. I’m so grateful to those members of our parish and school families who have entrusted their efforts to the Lord for the good of our community. If every one of us, as disciples of Christ, contributed whatever we could to Immaculate Conception, just imagine how much more God could provide through our generosity for the material and spiritual needs of all!

I encourage you, please, to spend some time in prayer and consider what you are able to contribute to the needs of our community – *your spiritual home!* Be confident. Be generous. In faith, let us entrust our offerings to the Lord so that He may multiply their good effects beyond measure. God bless you!
